Giving Opinions

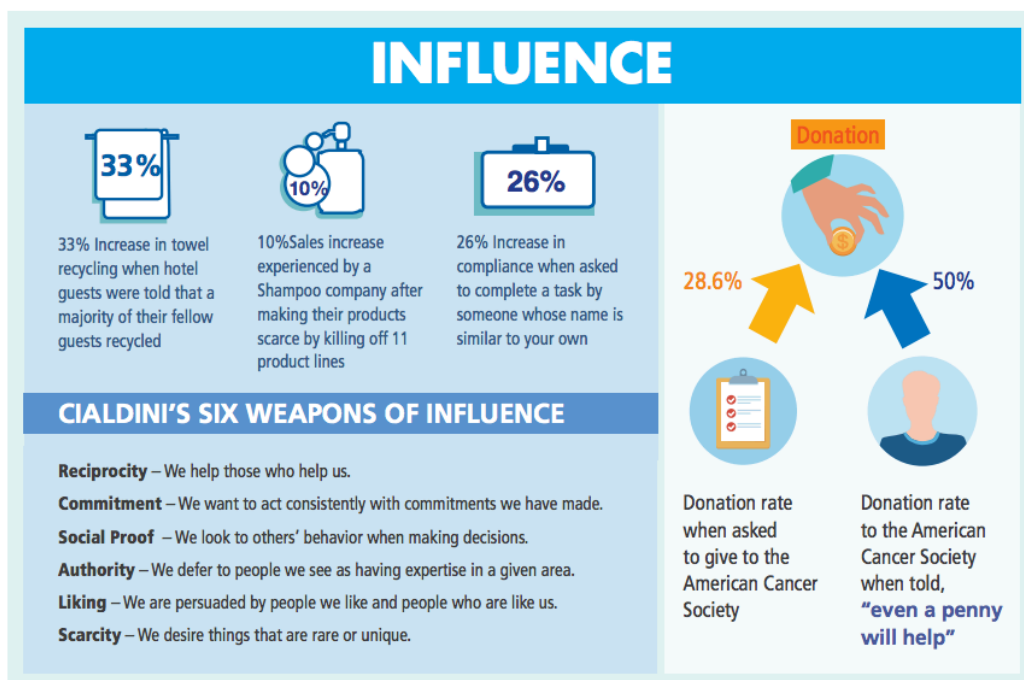
In my opinion...	I (honestly) think...	I (strongly) believe...

Agreeing

I (totally) agree with you/that.	I couldn't agree more.	I feel the same.
You are (absolutely) right.	I see where you are coming from.	

Disagreeing: (partially agree/minimize or acknowledge + disagreement)

I hear what you are saying, but I'm afraid I disagree.
 I don't completely agree with you/that.
 You are right in some areas, but I see things a little differently.
