Examples:

I am a doctor.
My friend is a doctor.
My friend likes me.
This car is mine.

You are a doctor.
Your friend is a doctor.
My friend likes you.
This car is yours.

He is a doctor.
His friend is a doctor.
My friend likes him.
This car is his.

She is a doctor.
Her friend is a doctor.
My friend likes her.
This is car is hers.

We are doctors.
Our friend is a doctor.
My friend likes us.
This car is ours.

They are doctors.
Their friend is a doctor.
My friend likes them.
This car is theirs.

He/She looks like... + **(noun/noun phrase) or (complete sentence)**

his mother. *a bird.* *he is lazy.* *she has a nice job.*

SIMPLE PRESENT: HABITS + FREQUENCY

I/You/We/They (do)...

He/She (does)...

I/You/We/They don't (do)...

He/She doesn't (do)...

Always/Usually/Sometimes/Rarely/Never

Once a day/ Twice a week/ Three times a month/ Every day/ Every two weeks

I **always wake up** at 7 am.

He **sometimes eat** junk food.

They **never play** cpu games.

John **drives** to work **every day**.

She **eats** junk food **three times a week**.

We **travel once a year**.

ABILITIES: CAN/CAN'T

He/she **can/can't** (do) something.

I **can sing** well.

We **can speak** English.

He **can't dance**.

They **can't drive**.

Likes/Dislikes:

He likes **pizza**.

He likes **to eat** pizza.

He likes **eating** pizza.

She doesn't like **sports**.

She doesn't like **to play** sports.

She doesn't like **playing** sports.
