## Narrating: Simple past/Past continuous/Past perfect



Simple Past: Used to describe a specific completed action

"I watched a movie last night." "I saw my friend this morning."

Past Continuous: Used to set the scene or to give the background information
Used to describe a long continuous action in the past
Used to describe multiple past events happening at the same time

"I was working for ABC at that time." "John was walking down the street when he saw her."

Past Perfect: Used to describe an event happening prior to the past event

"John took a wild swing and punched me. I had never been punched up until that point."
