

Hope vs Wish

	Hope - More likely or possible outcome	Wish - Less likely or impossible outcome
Past	I hope he didn't miss the bus. *When we don't know what happened.	I wish he hadn't missed the bus (He missed the bus - reality) I wish she could have come to the party (She didn't come to the party - reality)
Present	I hope he is happy.(now) I hope they are coming now.	I wish he was happy. I wish she wasn't crying. I wish I could sing well.
Future	I hope she passes the exam. I hope she gets the job. I hope he will visit me.	I wish I could travel this summer. I wish he would call me tonight. I wish you were going to attend our party tomorrow.
