"There is a problem with the project." John

"Send me the report." Mary

"Turn off the TV." Bob

"Are you satisfied with the project?" Brad

"What did the client want?" Adam

Someone (said/reported/mentioned) something.

John (said) there was a problem with the project. Mary (said) to send her the report.

Someone (told me) something.

John (told me) there was a problem with the project. Mary (told me) to send her the report.

Someone (said/told me) to do something.

Bob (said/told me) to turn off the TV.

Someone asked (me) something. *use the "indirect q/statement" rule

Brad asked (me) if I was satisfied with the project. Adam asked (me) what the client (had) wanted.

According to (someone/something), Statement

According to John, there was a problem with the project.
