Will I be living in London?

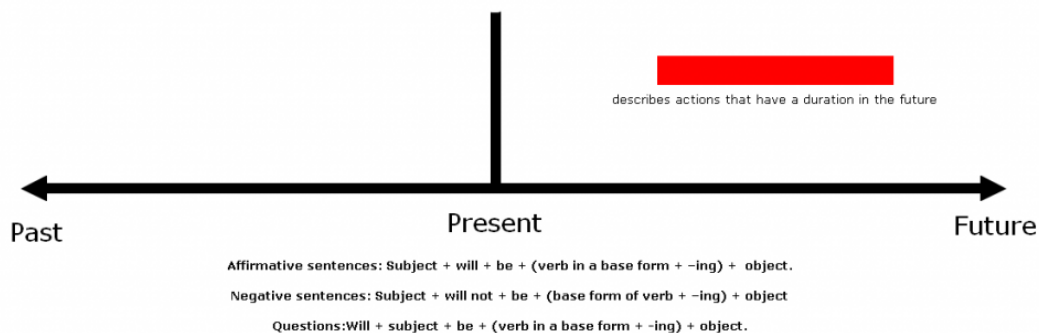

We can use the future continuous (will/won't be + -ing form) to talk about future actions that:

- will be in progress at a specific time in the future:
 - When you come out of school tomorrow, I'll be boarding a plane.
 - Try to call before 8 o'clock. After that, we'll be watching the match.
 - You can visit us during the first week of July. I won't be working then.
- we see as new, different or temporary:
 - Today we're taking the bus but next week we'll be taking the train.
 - He'll be staying with his parents for several months while his father is in recovery.
 - Will you be starting work earlier with your new job?
